- Jupiter: Planet of expansion and blessings; its influence enhances childbearing potential.
- Mars: Represents vitality, but afflictions may imply inflammation or injury in reproductive organs.
- Rahu and Ketu: Indicate karmic imbalances and are often linked to unexplained infertility or spiritual lessons tied to parenthood.

- Jupiter combust and retrograde.
- Rahu-Ketu axis on 1^{st.} and 7^{th.} houses.


